## LIMITED INDOOR MEETINGS AT THE SERENITY CENTER DURING COVID-19 CRISIS

The Serenity Center is now undergoing a partial opening. Limited indoor meetings have been approved by the Howard County Health Department, with the following restrictions:

1. The meeting size is restricted to the number of chairs the room can hold subject to 6 ft social distancing separation. <u>If all the chairs are full, the meeting is closed for anyone else</u>. That limit is 25 in Harmony Hall, the big room, and 12 in Quiet Waters, the smaller room. The fellowships must self-police this requirement. Proper social distancing of 6 ft separation minimum must be practiced.

2. <u>Use of face masks or face covering is required at all times indoors by</u> the Health Department.

3. For contact tracing, the Secretary/Leader must make a list of <u>first names</u> <u>and phone numbers of the meeting attendees and the date of the meeting.</u> This is to facilitate any contact tracing that may be needed, in the event that an attendee tests positive for COVID-19. This protects all the attendees. The Secretary/Leader should keep the list for 6 weeks, or so, and then it can be destroyed. The Secretary/Leader must provide their contact information to The Serenity Center, <u>info@theserenitycentercolumbia.org</u>. upon request. This practice is from the guidelines set by the Baltimore AA Intergroup for small group meetings during the COVID-19 crisis.

4. No coffee or food to be shared by the group is allowed. Individuals can still bring their own refreshments.

5. Each meeting needs to have a "Wipe-down volunteer" to wipe down the table surface, and contact surfaces, like the handles and door handles, in the bathrooms with the supplied disinfectant.
